HISTORY & SOCIETY

04 ANNE FRANK ZENTRUM

Learn all about Anne Frank and her famous diary in guided tours, films, workshops and readings. Or set out on a search for traces of the area's once thriving Jewish community and find out more about the personal fates that lie behind the Stolpersteine (stumbling stones).

05 ANTI-WAR MUSEUM

Founded in the wake of the horrors of the First World War, this is the first museum of its kind in the world. To mark its 100th anniversary, a new edition of the book "Krieg dem Kriege" ("War on War") will be published, accompanied by an exhibition. The original air-raid shelter is a reminder of the nightmarish feelings experienced by those who had to seek refuge here.

09 BERLIN MUSEUM OF MEDICAL HISTORY - CHARITÉ

On the trail of medical history. Learn what role the university hospital Charité played in National Socialism or in GDR border security. Surgical instruments such as saws and other marks will reveal their own history. The museum director will take you to the bedside of historical patients.

15 FOREIGN INTELLIGENCE SERVICE OF GERMANY VISITOR CENTRE

Uncovering secrets: the headquarters of the Foreign Intelligence Service of Germany is a top-secret fortress. The visitor centre provides information about the agency's mission and working methods. In addition to intelligence tasks, the Foreign Intelligence Service also deals with topics such as terrorism or the effects of climate change on geopolitics.

18 COMPUTER GAMES MUSEUM

Remember the eighties? The computer sounds of „Super Mario“ and other games have burned themselves into the long-term memory of just about everyone – not only gamers. Forget about the gaming console and rock the dance floor! Dance the night away to chiptune sounds and "Just Dance" classics or tap-dance your way to victory.

19 DDR MUSEUM

November 1989 not only saw the fall of the inner-German Wall, but also the museum's African collections in rhythmic spoken texts. With sitar and tabla, Sebastian Dreyer and Ravi Srinivasan will take you into the world of Indian ragas. Short films from India, Brazil, Nigeria and Kenya will uncover long-hidden secrets.

21 GERMAN HISTORICAL MUSEUM

Who hasn't wished they could slip into a painting from times gone by? The new children's exhibition makes it possible. Later in the night, take a trip to the Caribbean with salsa and bachata hits. Enjoy the show with a cocktail or shake a leg yourself.

22 GERMAN SPY MUSEUM

The Mission: saving the world. Set out on a search for old secret codes, encrypt your own messages, listen to secret radio transmissions, pass a lie detector test or wind your way through the laser maze in James-Bond-style – everyone becomes an agent in the German Spy Museum.

24 GERMANY MUSEUM

Immerse yourself in 2,000 years of German history. Write a medieval love song, solve a criminal case from the 1920s or barter your way to a good deal on the post-war black market. The immersive exhibition brings historical places to life. An experience for the whole family!

25 DOCUMENTATION CENTRE FOR DISPLACEMENT, EXPULSION, RECONCILIATION

Go on a musical journey: Moji and Pouriya Raisi will introduce you to the sounds of Iran with a long-necked tanbur guitar and a divan lute, while Ben Osborn and Kimia Bani combine Eastern and Western traditions. Accordion virtuoso Radu Ratoï will inspire you with contemporary pieces, while "Radio Django" will play jazz influenced by Synti music.

31 BERLIN-HOHENSCHÖNHAUSEN MEMORIAL

Between 1945 and 1989, over 20,000 people were imprisoned here. Like hardly any other place in Germany, this memorial in the former Stasi prison is linked to the political persecution that took place in the Soviet occupation zone and the German Democratic Republic (GDR). Take a tour of the Stasi prison, the prison kitchen and the prison hospital.

38 HUMBOLDT FORUM

It's about knowledge and compassion: artist David Dabiah will question the museum's African collections in rhythmic spoken texts. With sitar and tabla, Sebastian Dreyer and Ravi Srinivasan will take you into the world of Indian ragas. Short films from India, Brazil, Nigeria and Kenya will uncover long-hidden secrets.

40 JEWISH MUSEUM BERLIN

Let's talk about sex! During speed dates with experts, you'll learn everything there is to know about sexuality in Judaism – from marriage, taboos and questioning of social norms to pure desire and the eroticism of spirituality. Sex is more than a question of position – let yourself be enlightened!

47 MACHMITT CHILDREN'S MUSEUM

How do you keep a cool head? How do you become warm to someone? What causes sunshine in our hearts or thunder flies in our stomachs? Everything is constantly on the move. The interactive exhibition offers spaces in which to experience topics such as emotional chaos, the turn of the year, weather phenomena and climate change.

53 MUSEUM FOR COMMUNICATION BERLIN

Did you know that plants produce sounds? Méloëie Melak will be using synthesizers to bring them to life. A workshop will strengthen the connection between humans and nature by means of microbe tattoos, while a dance performance will make the symbiosis of queerness and sustainability good enough for the stage – as a perspective on climate protection.

65 CHARLOTTENBURG PALACE PRUSSIAN PALACES AND GARDENS FOUNDATION BERLIN-BRANDENBURG

Rooms within the palace were redesigned, destroyed and reconstructed. How can lost furnishings be revived? Provenance researcher Ulrike Schlingensief-Rietig will be talking about her work. With a twinkle or two in his eye, actor Oliver Kube will tell you about some of the unsolved mysteries of Prussian history.

66 GAY MUSEUM

It's showtime! Camp individuals together with drag kings and queens set the queer emancipation movement in motion. Let us surprise you. Internationally acclaimed stars such as Lolita Va Voom and artist Akynos will ensure a great atmosphere. Long live burlesque! Later, Gabi Tupper will guide you through "Love at First Fight".

68 STABI KULTURWERK BERLIN STATE LIBRARY - PRUSSIAN CULTURAL HERITAGE

Experience musical fireworks of newly interpreted classics from Europe and Latin America in the fountain courtyard. Admire treasures, such as the world's largest Hebrew parchment Bible, or take a look behind the scenes of the restoration studio and bookbinding to learn how an exhibition is created.

69 STASI MUSEUM BERLIN CAMPUS FOR DEMOCRACY

Today, the site of the former GDR Ministry of State Security is a place of education and enlightenment. During a night-time tour, the monstrous architecture of the former surveillance machinery will be lit up by a torch beam. Much will remain in the dark during this search for clues – be it unsolved murders or destroyed files.

71 TOPOGRAPHY OF TERROR GESTAPO, SS AND REICH SECURITY MAIN OFFICE ON WILHELMSTRASSE AND PRINZ-ALBRECHT-STRASSE

The current exhibition illustrates how extremists brought the Weimar Republic to the brink of civil war as well as the drastic means used by the Nazi government. Follow the lines of continuity created by political violence in Germany – from the Weimar Republic through the Nazi era to the present day.

73 WERKBUNDARCHIV MUSEUM OF THINGS

After its involuntary relocation, the first exhibition in its new premises reflects on the "Condition of the City". Top-class design objects and kitschy mass-produced items will all be waiting for you to unravel! In the "Room of the Unknown", selected items will be uncovered piece by piece. HISTORY OF BERLIN

07 ASISI PANORAMA BERLIN THE WALL - LIVING WITH THE DEATH STOP

The hyper-realistic installation by Yadegar Asisi reawakens everyday life in divided Berlin in the shadow of the Wall that split the city in two. Join a guided exploration tour, or discover escape tunnels and secret doors in the panorama. A film takes you behind the scenes of its creation.

12 BERLINER UNTERWELTEN E.V. "MYTH OF GERMANIA" EXHIBITION

With the redesign of Berlin as the capital of the German Reich, Adolf Hitler aimed to cement his claim to world domination. The multimedia exhibition "Myth of Germania" by Berliner Unterwelten e.V. in the underground station Gesundbrunnen illuminates the urban development plans for Berlin as drawn up by Hitler's chief architect Albert Speer.

37 HUGUENOT MUSEUM BERLIN IN THE FRENCH CATHEDRAL

What do the Waldensians in Italy have in common with the Huguenots in Berlin? Photographer Gustavo Alabiso will be exploring this question in conversation with journalist Christian Walther and also talk about the mafia, poverty and emigration. Round off the evening culinarily with some mid-night spaghetti.

48 MITTE MUSEUM

How does a museum deal with contaminated objects? Find out more about the results and perspectives of provenance research. An ensemble from the Fanny Hensel Music School and Björn Bergmann & Band will be playing easy listening and jazz music. Cornelia Schönwald will be singing chansons by Edith Piaf – you won't have any regrets tonight!

49 MUSEUM OTTO WEIDT'S WORKSHOP FOR THE BLIND GERMAN RESISTANCE MEMORIAL CENTER FOUNDATION

"Never forget what happened" is the message from Inge Deutsch-Kron, a Holocaust survivor who was once an employee in Otto Weidt's workshop. Her autobiography has been staged by the GRIPS Theater. Actresses Hanna Petkoff and Regine Seidler have adapted the play as a reading for this evening.

51 MUSEUM EPHRAIM PALAIS STIFTUNG STADTMUSEUM BERLIN

The "BerlinerZeit" exhibition focuses, among other things, on the beginnings of queer emancipation. Curator Matthias Hahn will be giving insights into the background. For those who prefer to shake a leg, DJ Wythe will be putting on some Charleston, Lindy Hop, Foxtrot or Mambo, and the "Dukish Vagabonds" will be playing swing and jazz.

55 MUSEUM KNOBLAUCHHAUS STIFTUNG STADTMUSEUM BERLIN

Home at last: a number of objects from the estate of the merchant family Knoblauch are now back on display in the museum. Why is that and where have they been until now? Salon music by Bach and Mendelssohn, played on lute piano and violin, will reawaken the sound of the Biedermeier era.

45 KW INSTITUTE FOR CONTEMPORARY ART

Find out more about Brazilian subcultures or the colonial connections between Denmark and Greenland, or take a look at the 1970s photography produced by New York's queer fetish subculture. Olympia Bukkakis & Friends will guide you through the night from 11 pm. Karaoke is more than just singing a song – clear the stage!

50 MUSEUM OF UNHEARD (OF) THINGS

A "museum of spurned love" or rather one of "toxic artefacts"? No matter what you choose, here you can find out all about imaginary museums. And Berlin's smallest museum is growing – Roland Albrecht invites you to witness the launch of the "Museum of Reframing" that reinterprets well-known art treasures.

58 NEUE NATIONALGALERIE BERLIN STATE MUSEUMS

You've never seen Andy Warhol like this before: this exhibition is the first ever to focus on his queer desire and his constant search for beauty as key elements of his work. Let yourself be seduced! Trigger warning! Meanwhile, children can draw their own beloved stars on paper.

60 PALAISPOPULAIRE

Her name itself signals a link to a German word for revelry and merrymaking: Gali's paintings – long considered a marginal phenomenon of the "Neue Wilde" movement – still dance to a different tune. What a discovery! The Berliner Philharmoniker's education programme will provide the musical accompaniment to the evening, while artists of the spoken word will compete in a poetry slam.

63 SAMMLUNG SCHARF-GERSTENBERG BERLIN STATE MUSEUMS

The world is out of shape: Bernard Schultze's informal "Großes Migro-Labyrinth" (1966) is reminiscent of the sometimes absurd stagings of the surrealists and is characterised by a labyrinthine design vocabulary full of secrets. Follow the red thread!

01 ABBUSS-SAMMLUNG ANTIKER PLASTIK

Sometimes, only the plaster casting mould of a work of art has survived; other times, statues look completely different today than they did in their original form. Learn all about the history of individual pieces in guided tours or witness a plaster cast maker restoring a column's destroyed capital.

03 ALTES MUSEUM BERLIN STATE MUSEUMS

Beautiful as Aphrodite, dreadful as Medusa? While mortal women played second fiddle in ancient society, goddesses ran riot on Mount Olympus. This exhibition sheds light on female role models in ancient mythology and looks beyond the stereotypes. Let yourself be inspired!

39 JAMES SIMON GALLERY BERLIN STATE MUSEUMS

This show about the Nile island of Elephantine provides the first-ever insights into the 4,000 years of history surrounding this trading centre and cultural melting pot. Numerous ancient Egyptian writings attest to the island's plurality, religion, trade, law and medicine. Discover this unique location's cosmopolitan society.

59 NEUES MUSEUM BERLIN STATE MUSEUMS

Follow the trail of the hidden god Amun or sink down into the underworld. For ancient Egyptians, the afterlife was a beautiful yet dangerous place. Praised in the Illiad, razed by the Greeks, excavated by Heinrich Schliemann – but did the legendary city of Troy really exist? Find out more!

64 SAMURAI MUSEUM BERLIN PETER JANSSEN COLLECTION

Three decades of twinning between Berlin and Tokyo: this show presents the seven virtues of the legendary samurai warriors using original objects from the collection. Many of them have come a long way, which often remains hidden. Find out in what way the samurai have always been part of Berlin's history.

Since 1902, Berlin's city districts have been connected by the underground. The museum run by Berlin's public transport company, the BVG, presents the history of the underground by means of around 300 objects, including a historic clock station and an electromechanical level signal box. Try it out for yourself! Live music will ensure a pleasant atmosphere until midnight.

11 BERLINER UNTERWELTEN E.V. AEG-TUNNEL

Berlin's underground network started with this tunnel, which was completed in 1897. Let yourself be enchanted in this piece of underground history by the light and sound installation created specially for the location's unique acoustics by the American artist group "Seafomo Palace". Please register in advance to take part!

23 GERMAN MUSEUM OF TECHNOLOGY LADESTRASSE AND SCIENCE CENTER SPECTRIUM

Try, touch, marvel: interactive points for experiments invite you to explore scientific phenomena. How does research work at -40°C? What does the Arctic hide? Researchers from the research vessel "Polarstern" will be searching for things, ideas and inventions that are definitely worth surviving in a time capsule.
