Tickets for the Long Night of Museums are available from today!

With just a single ticket you can experience 75 museums and more than 750 events on the theme of love – that's what the Long Night of Museums will be offering on 30 August in Berlin. Ticket sales started today.

The central meeting point for the Long Night of Museums will once again be on the Museum Island, where all museums will be open in celebration of the anniversary year. Shuttle buses will then take you to museums spread across all of Berlin's districts, from big crowd-pullers to hidden gems.

Among this year's many programme highlights will be the hidden-object game "Symbols of Love – Collect tattoos!" jointly organised by five Charlottenburg museums – including Charlottenburg Palace, the Bröhan Museum and the Käthe Kollwitz Museum Berlin: at each station, visitors young and old can discover special objects related to the theme of love and receive a temporary tattoo as a souvenir. Polyrama – Museum for Life Stories will be participating in the Long Night of Museums for the first time and staging the interactive storytelling game Cheating with Polyrama, in which strangers meet and share personal stories, experiences and perspectives – for a surprisingly deep look at themselves and others. At this year's Long Night, the DDR Museum will be dedicated to fan love: in discussion rounds titled Between Grandstand and Showcase – The History of the Eisbären Berlin, exclusive guests will be talking about the legendary ice hockey club's journey from its roots in the German Democratic Republic to becoming the record champion in the German ice hockey league. Every hour, a special performance of the current "sound intervention" can be experienced in the Neue Nationalgalerie: the atmospheric fog sculpture by Fujiko Nakaya enters into a sensual dialogue with specially composed pieces of music. At Fotografiska you can experience the universe of ToiletFotoPaperGrafiska one last time – accompanied on the occasion of the Long Night by DJ Z.O.mbie's electronic sounds, which combine house, techno and groove with visual satire.

From 4 to 17 August, tickets can be purchased for 15 euros, reduced price 12 euros; from 18 August onwards, tickets cost 23 euros, reduced price 17 euros. Children up to the age of 12 have free admission but need a free children's ticket. The ticket enables you to visit all participating museums and use the Long Night shuttle buses.
