LONG NIGHT OF MUSEMS 2026 IN THE GRIP OF CRIME: “CRIME IN BERLIN”

Exploring dark places, mysterious murders and infamous clubs: the Long Night of Museums will take place on the 29th of August 2026 for the 44th time around the theme of “Crime in Berlin”. On that night, 75 museums with around 750 events will take visitors deep into the exciting world of crime – save the date!

What were the most spectacular art thefts and were the stolen pieces ever found again? How did the three men whose bones were found in the yard of St Peter’s Church die? And what bizarre items do customs officials pull out of the luggage of travellers? At 750 events, visitors to the Long Night of Museums can investigate the secrets of crime.

Threatening letters and ransom notes will be analysed at the German Spy Museum, you can explore the settings of “Babylon Berlin” all around Kurfürstendamm and the Copycats will discuss men who rob women in their live podcast at the PalaisPopulaire. The passion for crime will be celebrated with criminal tango, Moka Efti swing and crime karaoke, as well as activities and puzzlehunts to take part in for young art forgers and detectives.

With just one ticket, the Long Night of Museums allows access to 75 museums, collections, foundations and memorials all over Berlin. Apart from exhibitions, there will also be a varied programme of guided tours, talks, concerts, workshops, performances and DJ sets.
